



Peterborough Rural Crime and Information Update – 1st to 03rd Oct 2016

Please find enclosed reported crime and incidents of note during the above period.

Hare coursing : A silver SUBARU with an 'R' index is being reported in the Thorney area and we are seeing many calls in the Northborough area of this vehicle and several others – Silver Grand Cherokee Jeep (KY index) containing 4 males and these males are reported to be very aggressive. Others vehicles to note : Maroon Toyota 4WD and a Silver Nissan (T index). I would urge residents in these areas to call in details if you see such a vehicle hare coursing. Gaining the vehicle index is really important although can be very difficult. All incidents are being forward to our Rural Crime Team.

Northborough Ward

- Perkins Lane, Maxey - burglary 12/9. A resident noted a suspicious vehicle in the area and officers arrested 3 males from Peterborough. All have been charged with this offence and remanded in custody awaiting sentencing.
- High St, Maxey – suspicious vehicle: Black Ford Mondeo (56 plate) seen acting suspiciously in the area.

Glington and Wittering Ward

- St Benedicts Close, Glington – burglary 23/9. Offender (s) smashed a window to gain entry and stole a number of items. A male was seen in the area earlier that day – white, approx. 6ft aged 30s wearing a red cap. Investigations are ongoing.
- Peterborough Road, Castor – attempt burglary 23/9. Two males were seen to enter a property but were disturbed by the owner and made off in a maroon Ford Focus that has since been recovered. Investigations are ongoing.
- Walton Road, Marholm – Suspicious male & female 14/9. Female with ginger hair visited address to sell bracelets then a male visited wanting to sell a generator and when refused he was seen to drive off in a white transit van with a 13 index. Male described as 6ft, spikey grey hair wearing a blue and white checked shirt and light trousers.
- The Willows, Glington – theft from motor vehicle 3/9. Catalytic converter removed from a Mitsubishi 4WD.
- Websters Close, Glington – burglary 02/9. Rear window smashed and electrical items stolen including an LG 50 inch TV.

Barnack Ward

- Wittering Road, Barnack – 02/10 theft from motor vehicle. Offender smashed window to gain entry and steal items from within.
- Broad Wheel Road, Helpston – 06/09 theft of a JCB digger from site.

Eye and Thorney Ward

- Deerhurst Way, Eye – burglary on 3/10 where a window was smashed and jewellery stolen. Please note that officers have made an arrest in connection with this and other similar crimes and we hope to update you on this arrest next month.
- St Bees Drive, Eye – burglary on 6/9 where offenders gained entry and stole keys to a brand new blue Audi. Vehicle has not been recovered.
- St Marys Close, Thorney – burglary on 15/9
- Waltham Walk, Eye – garage burglary 25/9 where a male aged 21-40yrs wearing a grey hooded top and with a small dog was seen to gain entry into a garage. Male was chased and made off on a stolen BMX bike.
- Tintern Rise, Eye – 3 males in hoodies seen on 16/9 acting suspiciously near a garage that housed a motorcycle.

Please note that we have had a report of a Red Ford Fiesta (Y index) acting suspiciously in the Eye area with 3 males inside the vehicle. All residents should remain vigilant and report anything at all suspicious immediately.

Newborough, Borough Fen and Eye Green Ward

- Mainly hare coursing incidents as per above. No crimes reported.

Please note that we are continuing to see thefts from sheds/garages throughout the city and it would appear that bikes and tools are the target items. Anyone wishing to have specific crime prevention advice can get in touch via email or telephone and I will be happy to help.
