GLINTON PARISH COUNCIL – SURFACE TREATMENT

It is proposed to undertake carriageway surface treatment works on the following streets in the Glinton ward and these are:

Beech Road (Helpston Road to Oak Road);
Chestnut Close (Beech Road to End);
Oak Road (Elm Crescent to End);
Elm Crescent (Oak Road to Beech Road);
Welmore Road (from the new construction site to the end of the road);
Scotts Road (Welmore Road to Vergette Road);
Neaverson Road (Scotts Road to Holmes Road);
Holmes Road (Vergette Road to End);
Walker Road (Scotts Road to Holmes Road) &
Vergette Road (Holmes Road to Scotts Road).

These works are expected to commence on Monday 13th March 2017, subject to contract, and will last for approximately nine days.

The surface treatment that we will be using on the above sites is known as a Micro Asphalt and this is a nationally used surface treatment. Micro Asphalt will seal the existing road surface and extend the life of carriageway. When Micro Asphalt is first laid it takes a while to settle down and will look like a finished road surface over time. This might give the appearance of an unfinished job, however this will settle down.

Please note that the surface treatment is weather dependant and if we are unable to carry out the works we shall leave the road open until such time as we are able to carry out the works on site.

While the works are undertaken the road will be closed and there will be 'No Parking' cones placed throughout the sites. The works will be carried out from Monday to Friday between the hours of 09.30 to 15.30 and there might be the need to work on the weekend. However if this is the case then we shall advertise this on site to advise the residents. There will be slight delays while the material cures.

Leaflets will be delivered to the residents of streets affected prior to works starting on site.
