

CLERKS REPORT ON THE PRODUCTION OF THE LOCAL PLAN

Peterborough City Council have issued a 48 page document on the Key issues raised during the second round of consultation for the Local plan following their review of sites proposed in the first round of consultation

The 48 page document is backed by links to 2014 observations from 1056 different persons or bodies

On the basis of the exchange of emails below it is apparent that the parish council should agree a mechanism to review the "Key issues" document and the 2014 observations made, in order to determine which refer to sites within Glinton. The parish council will then be prepared to comment on the revisions made to the local plan if any of the observations are deemed sufficient to vary the existing draft plan which excludes any development in Glinton
